REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED IN THE MONTH OF MAY

<u>Float and Sink Activity-</u> Nursery students participated in a Float and Sink Activity to learn about the characteristics of objects that either sink or float. Using a water tub, children experimented with various live objects, both heavy and light, to understand the difference between them. This activity also helped coordinate and control their hand-eye movements. The children enjoyed the hands-on learning experience, making it both educational and fun.



<u>Tearing and Pasting Activity</u>- In Nursery class, a 'Tearing and Pasting Activity' was conducted to develop motor skills and encourage artistic expression. Students tore yellow glace paper into small pieces and pasted them to create a sun. This innovative activity helped children explore their creative side while improving fine motor skills.



<u>Letter'h'Activity</u> - The 'Hh- Hit Me' activity was conducted in Nursery class to reinforce the recognition of the letter 'H' and words starting with its sound. Children enjoyed using hammers to hit words beginning with 'H'. This activity effectively reinforced letter recognition and phonetic awareness while keeping the students engaged and entertained.



<u>VIBGYOR Activity</u> The Nursery students took active part in VIBGYOR Activity. They pasted different coloured circles to form the number seven, representing the seven colours of the rainbow. This activity enhanced their fine motor skills, imagination, and creativity.



Water Transferring Activity During the Water Transferring Activity, Pre-Nursery students repeatedly transferred water from one tumbler to another using a glass. This engaging activity facilitated the development of gross motor skills and eye-hand coordination among the kids. They thoroughly enjoyed the process and eagerly participated multiple times.



Pom Pom Activity- In this activity, children placed pom poms in a straight line. It helped them reinforce their understanding of the concept of a standing line and facilitated the development of fine motor skills and eye-hand coordination. They enthusiastically participated and enjoyed the task.



Grouping of Tens and Ones Activity UKG students learned about place value using a fun activity with straws. They grouped the straws to show tens and ones in numbers. By doing this, they understood how many ones make up a ten and what place value means in a number. This hands-on activity made learning math more enjoyable and helped them understand better.





<u>Number Pocket Activity</u> - This activity helped the students learn the concept of what comes before and after. They used flashcards with numbers and placed them in the right pockets. Through this activity, they also reinforced forward and backward counting.





<u>Letter Basket Activity</u> An engaging 'Letter Basket Activity' was conducted for LKG students. This activity provides a fun and interactive way for kids to practice and recognize letters. During the activity, students not only work on identifying the letters but also practice their sounds. This activity helped the students improve their letter recognition and phonetic skills in an enjoyable manner.



Role Play (Golden Words) Activity A 'Role Play Activity' was conducted for LKG students on May 6th. Through this activity, children learned important etiquette for interacting with others. They were introduced to golden words, which lay the foundation for politeness and courtesy. This activity will help the students grow into humble and confident individuals.



Fun Science Activity- A fun science activity is a hands-on experiment that helps students enjoy learning science through interactive play. On May 14th, LKG students performed an activity in which they used gems to create beautiful rainbows, observing the colours as they changed and blended. This activity not only introduced basic scientific concepts but also helped children sort and classify colours, enhancing their understanding of colour mixing and patterns.
