Role Play- The students of UKG participated in a role-play activity on the topic 'Good Habits and Manners.' 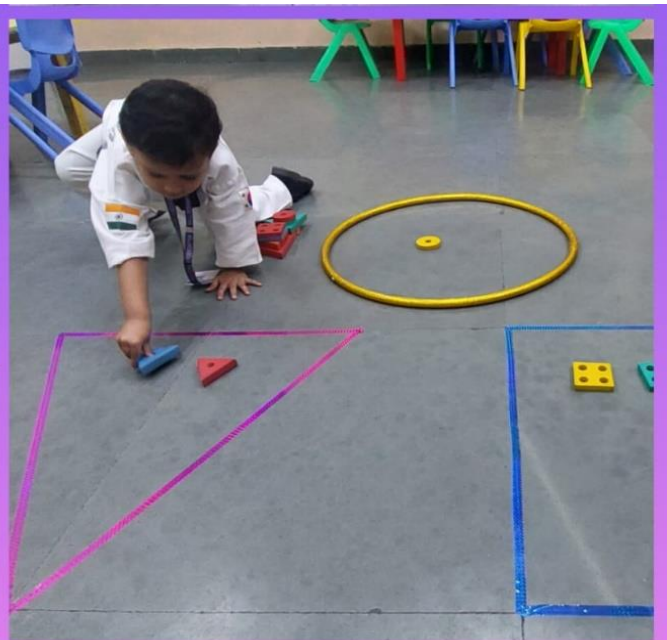
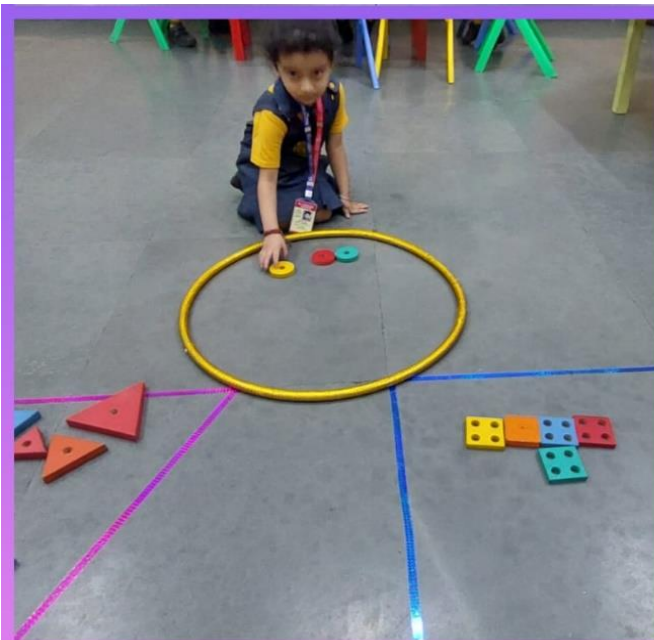
