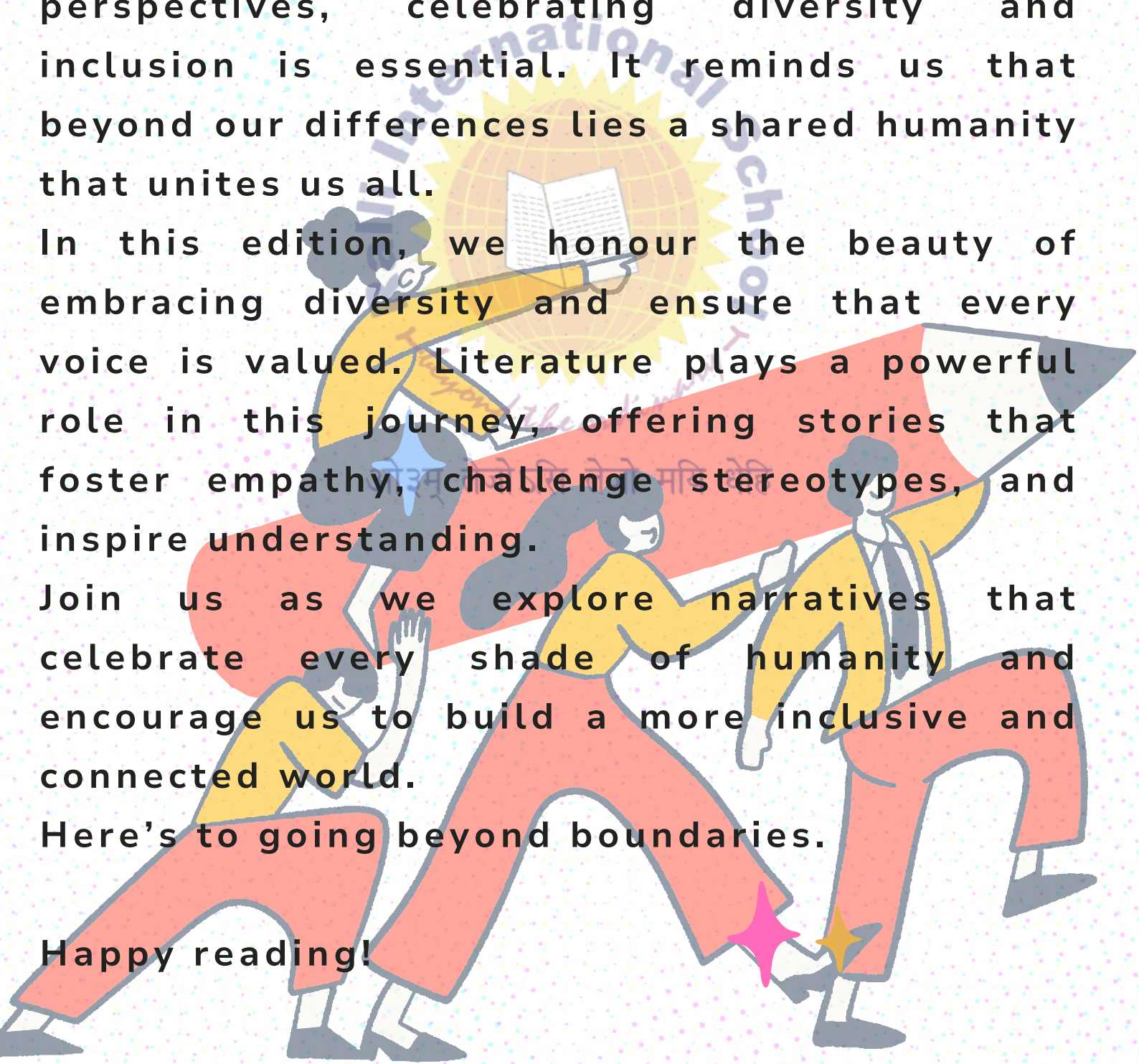

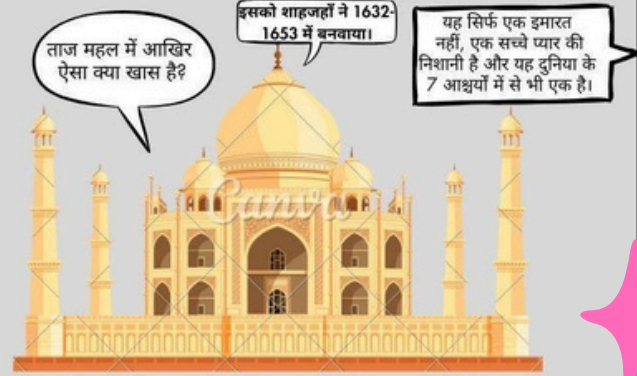
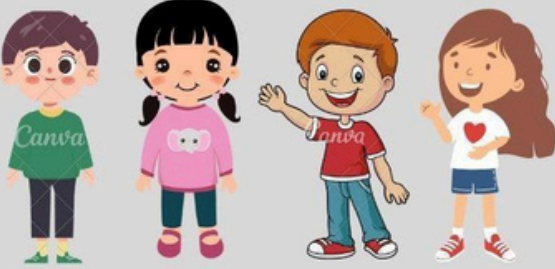

ARUNIMA SINHA: LEADING HER WAY

Arunima Sinha was born in Ambedkar Nagar, Uttar Pradesh. She has an elder sister and a younger brother. Her father was in the Indian Army, and her mother worked in the health department. When Arunima was just three years old, her father passed away, leaving her mother to take care of the family.

Arunima loved playing football and was also a national-level volleyball player. She received a call from the CISF (Central Industrial Security Force) to attend an interview and was asked to travel from Lucknow to Delhi. While traveling on the Padmavati Express train, some robbers boarded and tried to snatch her bag. They also attempted to take her necklace, but she resisted. In retaliation, the robbers pushed her out of the moving train. Arunima fell on the tracks and was unable to move. She remained there the entire day. Tragically, a train coming from the opposite direction crushed her leg and knee. The next day, some villagers found her and rushed her to the hospital. She suffered severe injuries, and the doctors had to amputate her leg to save her life. After four months of treatment, she was fitted with a prosthetic leg provided free of cost by a Delhi-based Indian company.

Determined to overcome her challenges, Arunima decided to climb Mount Everest. She contacted Bachendri Pal, the first Indian woman to climb Mount Everest, for guidance. Following Bachendri Pal's advice, Arunima joined a basic mountaineering course at the Nehru Institute of Mountaineering and the TATA Steel Adventure Foundation. Before attempting Mount Everest, she successfully climbed Island Peak. She was trained and guided by her instructor, Susan Mahout, for her Everest expedition. On May 21, 2013, Arunima Sinha achieved her goal and reached the summit of Mount Everest, becoming an inspiration to millions. She went on to climb several other peaks, including Kilimanjaro, Elbrus, Kosciuszko, Mount Vinson, and Aconcagua. Arunima was also honored with the prestigious Padma Shri award.

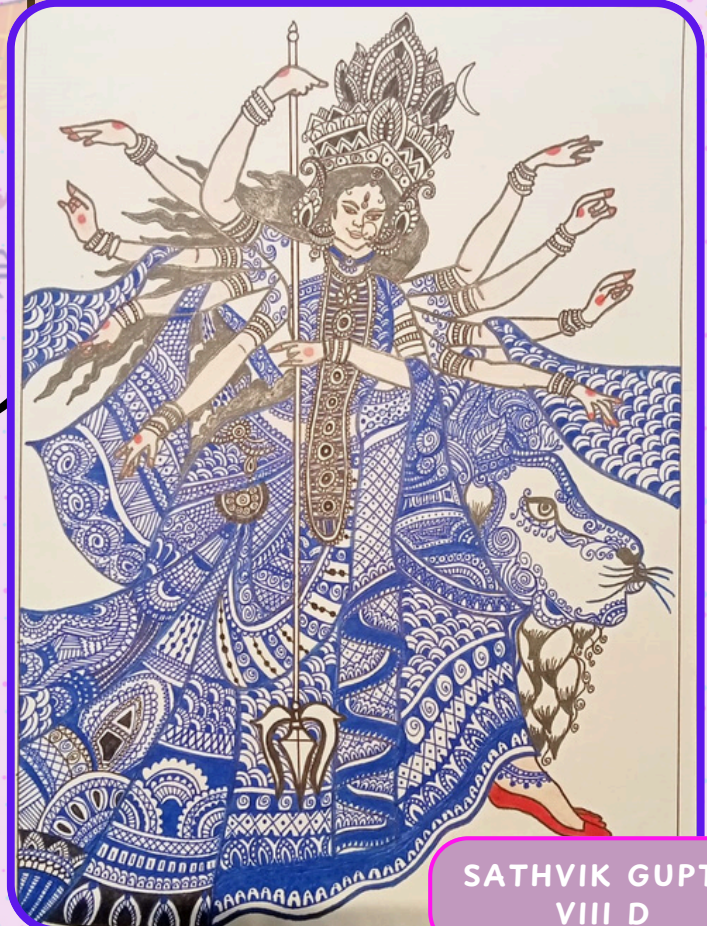
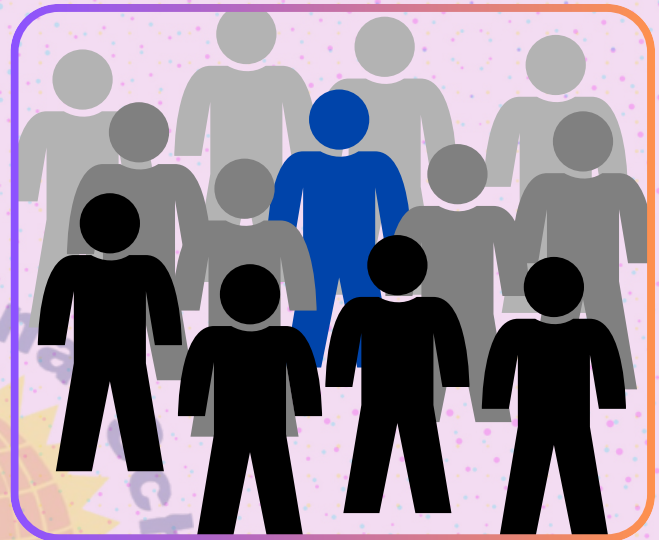

ABILITIES, NOT DISABILITIES: STORIES OF STRENGTH

सुधा चंद्रन एक भारतीय कलाकार हैं, जिन्होंने एक हादसे में अपने पैर गंवा दिए थे, परंतु उन्होंने इस विकलांगता को परास्त किया। उनकी कहानी बहुत से लोगों के लिए प्रेरणास्रोत है। वह एक उत्कृष्ट भरतनाट्यम नृत्यांगना थीं, जिन्होंने 1981 में एक भयानक बस हादसे में अपने दाहिने पैर को खो दिया था। सिर्फ 17 साल की आयु में, सुधा चंद्रन ने एक जीवन-परिवर्तनकारी दुर्घटना का सामना किया, जिसके कारण उनका एक पैर नष्ट हो गया। मई 1981 में, एक दिन, सुधा ने तमिलनाडु के तिरुचि में एक बस दुर्घटना में अपने प्यारे पैरों को नुकसान पहुंचाया। उनके पैर सीट के नीचे फंस गए, जिससे उन्हें सर्जरी और दर्द की वजह से परेशानी हुई। बाद में उनकी दाहिनी जांघ और बाएं टखने में भी चोट लग गई। स्थानीय अस्पताल में दिए गए अनुपयुक्त उपचार के कारण उनके दाएं पैर में गैंग्रीन हो गया। चंद्रन का कहना है कि इस अवस्था ने उनके जीवन को सबसे मुश्किल समय में डाल दिया था।

वैज्ञानिकों ने उनके दाहिने पैर का क्षेत्र जोड़कर एक कीड़े के समान बना दिया। उन्होंने कृत्रिम ऑर्थोपेडिक इंप्लांट की आवश्यकता महसूस की, जिससे उनके पैर की दोनों उंगलियां सीमित हो गईं। कुछ महीनों के बाद, वह हादसे के बाद मंच पर वापस आ गईं। 1984 में उन्होंने मयूरी नामक हिंदी फिल्म में अभिनय किया, जो उनकी दोस्त कल्पना चावला के जीवन पर आधारित थी। मयूरी की हिंदी रीमेक नाचे मयूरी में 1986 में उन्होंने अपनी भूमिका को दोहराया।

सुधा आज भी एक प्रेरणा के स्रोत के रूप में मानी जाती हैं, क्योंकि उन्होंने यह यकीन दिलाया कि उनकी विकलांगता वास्तव में एक सामर्थ्य थी।

Global warming and climate change are also responsible

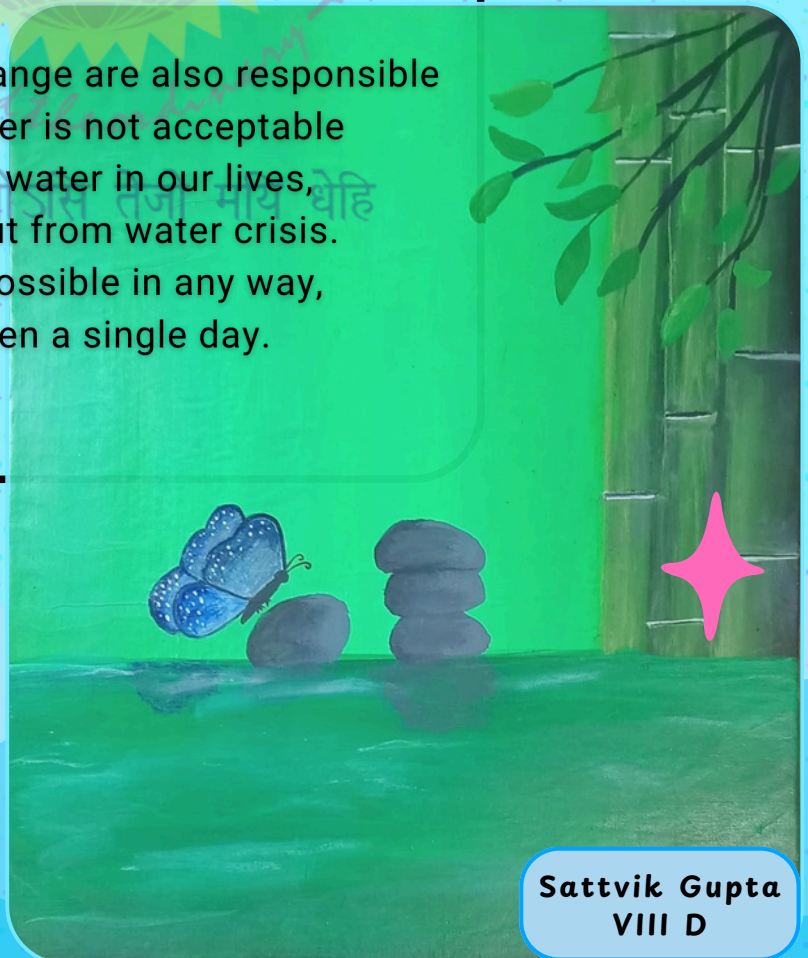

4. What would you say are your greatest strengths and weaknesses, and how do you manage them effectively?

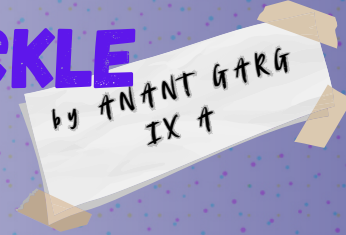

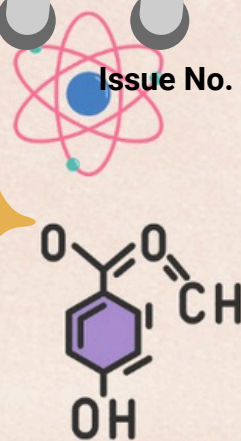
