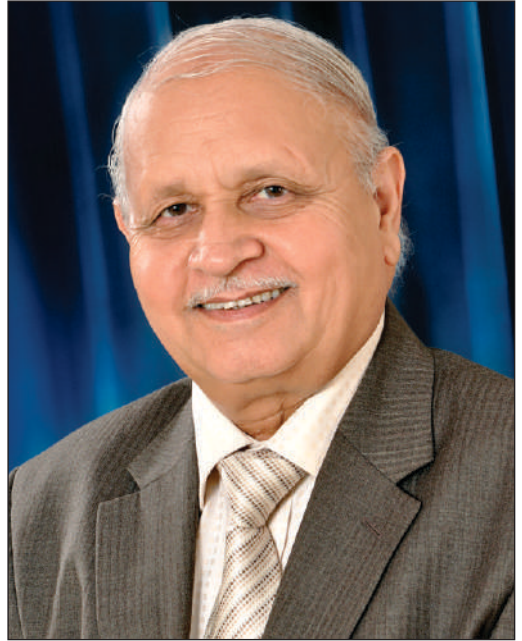
I congratulate them and would specially like to thank them for making 'yatra' a reality. May God bless them and all the homes and hands which will receive this magazine.

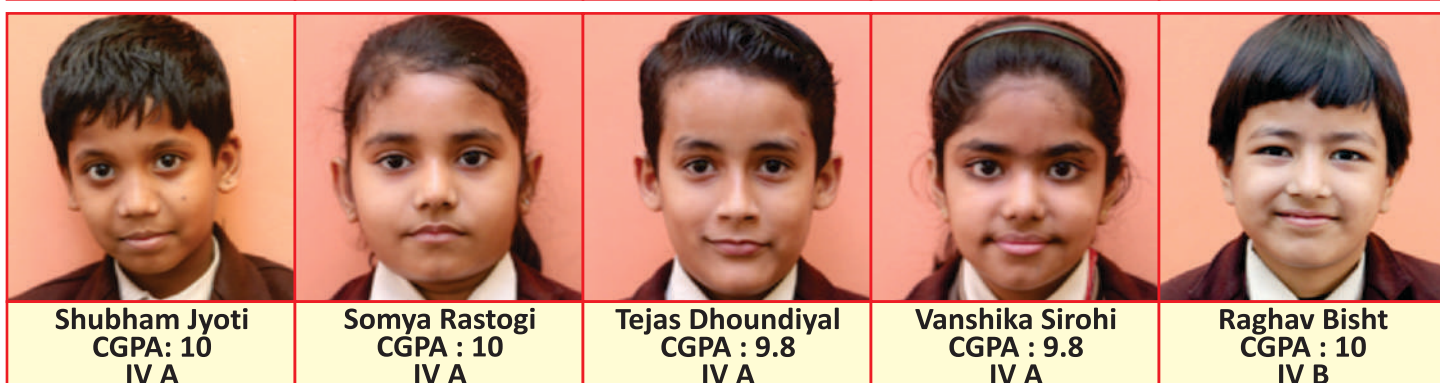

# New at RIS

It is a matter of immense pleasure and great pride that Ralli International School has opened a new Kindergarten wing at Nyay Khand I, Indirapuram, Ghaziabad".*



**R**alli International Kindergarten proudly stands as the largest pre-school in Indirapuram built in an area of 1700 Sq. yds. The building is aesthetically designed and constructed to provide all necessities of a pre-school. The infrastructure is designed in a way that the children can have opportunity to learn through play. The classrooms are designed with safety in mind, with ample ventilation and natural light. Each classroom is provided with smart board and extensive display board. Learning is made accessible and exciting through various displays and the whole environment is child compatible. The classrooms are under CC TV surveillance.





The washrooms are easily accessible and child friendly, designed to promote self usage and Toilet training.

Fire sprinklers, alarms and smoke detectors have been placed at regular intervals and are routinely checked. Ralli International Kindergarten has a full time nurse in school and in case of medical emergency the students are taken to the finest hospitals for treatment.

The campus has 24 x 7 security cover with guards stationed at the front and rear gate and in front of the building. The building and outdoor field are under CC TV surveillance with event recording facilities to keep a check on any incident.



Ralli International School has scaled new heights with every passing year. At RIK we believe in giving our students strong values along with a set of wings that will carry them far and wide. Ralli International Kindergarten is a pre-school traditionally based on teaching with play-way method. Our curriculum aims to prepare children for school success and lifelong learning. We also encourage them to explore all the possibilities and provide our students with multi cultural and enriched learning environment. We always focus to make our tiny tots develop into dynamic, responsible and creative personalities that can shine out in the crowd. Our teaching methodology aims at providing an atmosphere where students are encouraged to be creative, imaginative, and inquisitive instead of being routinely loaded with academic burden.



A day at RIK starts with the " Morning Assembly" where our tiny tots get an extra edge over others to carve out a niche for themselves. They become confident and out spoken when they perform on the stage. The kids enjoy gliding happily through warm up and yogic exercises.



All the festivals are celebrated with great verve and enthusiasm. Our little Rallians dress up according to each theme. Special assemblies are organized and informative presentation is given so that they understand our cultural and traditional heritage.

A well equipped and highly motivated team of teachers make the teaching and learning process an exciting and meaningful journey for the young learners. Teachers constantly motivate and inspire students to deliver their best. The class room has been aesthetically designed so as to encourage early literacy through wall displays on various themes, pictures and interactive boards. In addition to this, smart boards make learning more interesting. Smart classes use all interactive modules like video and presentations and these visually attractive methods of teaching are very helpful for the students in understanding the concept.

Smart board technology in classroom helps in enriching the curriculum by taking typical lesson and turning it into a fun, more interactive one. All the lessons delivered in RIK are made more exciting for children through smartboards.



Montessori education is cumulative . It slowly builds a solid and meaningful foundation on which more abstract learning can take place. We plant these seeds in kindergarten which are then harvested later. "The scope and practice of Montessori is beyond the mere transference of information and can be best understood in the context of the developing wholeness of the individual: where every aspect of the child's work contains a part of the whole child, physically and in his psyche with respect to what he has already learnt, what he is learning now, and what he needs to be prepared to learn in the future.

At RIK we have well equipped Montessori lab wherein a child can develop multiple skills. It also enables the child to problem solving, to use his hands and all his senses, to repeat an activity and achieve mastery.



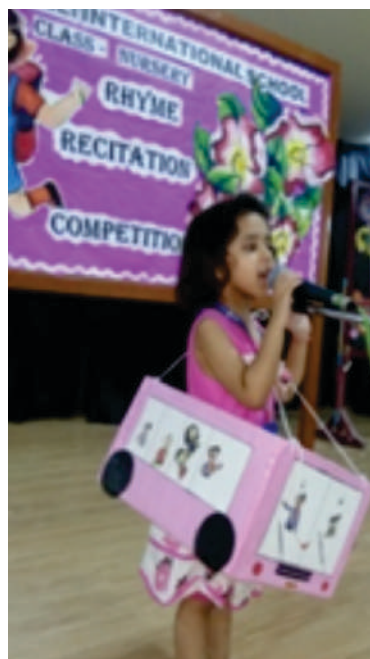
Reading is Fundamental. It develops your brain, provides a window into the world around you and helps you to do better. Here at RIS we emphasize on reading as reading opens the door to a child's early academic success, imparts love for learning and leads to higher grades.

To improve the vocabulary, motor skills and hand writing of the children, dictation is conducted in all the classes.

Today's child cannot just be an academician or an artist or sports person. We need to identify the innate person of a child at the earliest and make him bloom into a happy and successful human being. Therefore we emphasize on 3H theory – putting head, hand and heart in various activities such as paper folding, paper crumpling, tearing & pasting etc.



We make our little angels fight stage fear by making them participate in various competitions like Hindi & English rhyme recitation, Share your thought etc. We make sure that each child gets a chance to participate so as to ensure physical development of the child. We plan age appropriate indoor and outdoor games. Use of the outdoors makes a major contribution to physical and environmental education and enhances many other curriculum areas. It contributes to personal growth and awareness and develops skills for life & the world of work. Qualities such as a sense of responsibility and a purpose in life are nurtured. We have a skating rink for the development of gross motor skills. We provide a platform for physical fitness, outdoor games which lead to the overall development of the child.

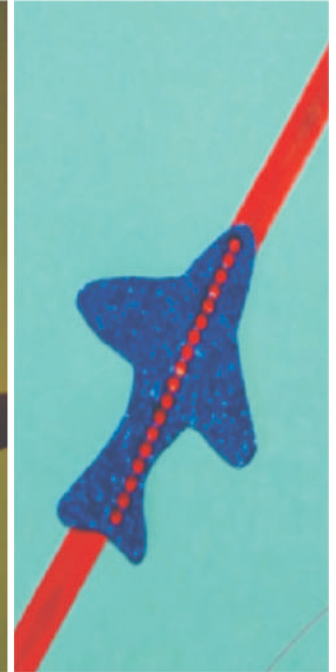


# Our Little Ones in Action

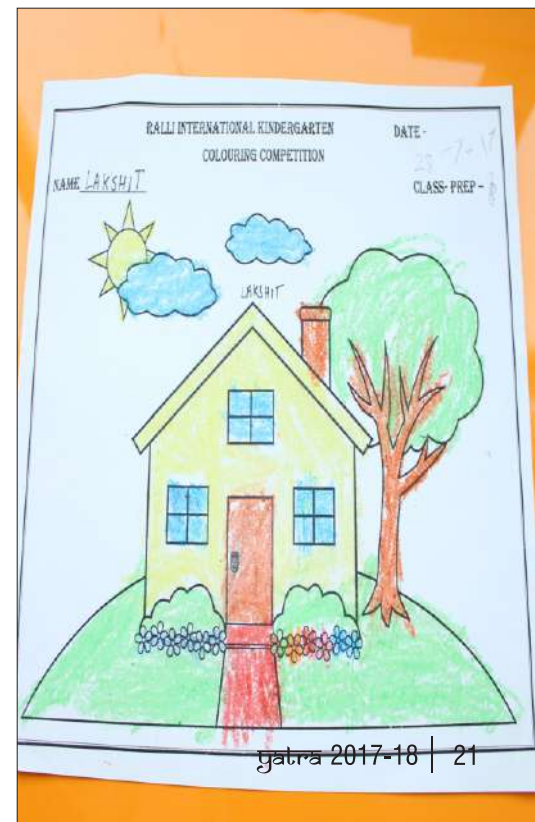
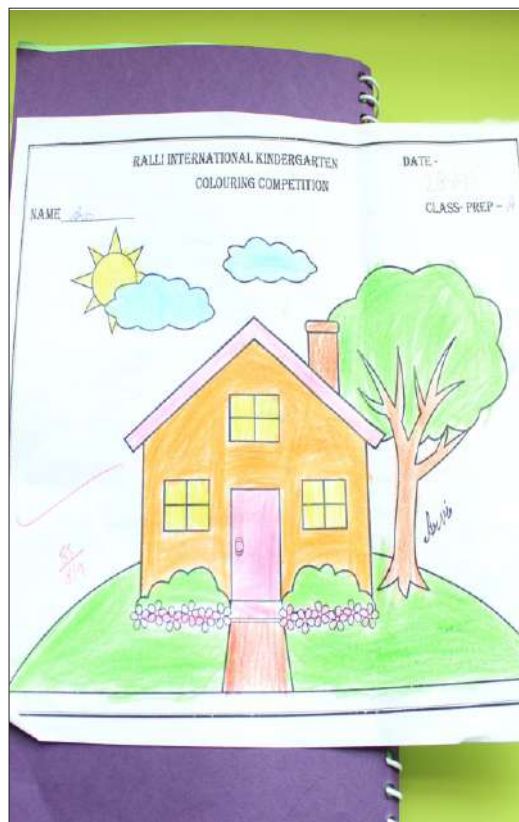


## Story Telling

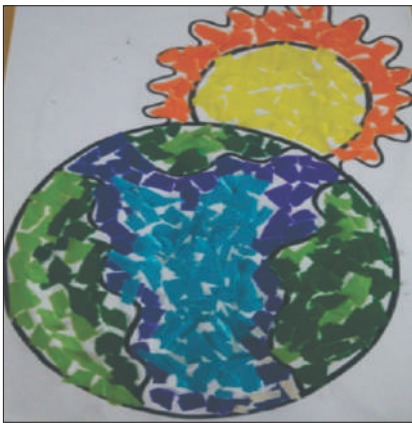
## Celebrating Special Days

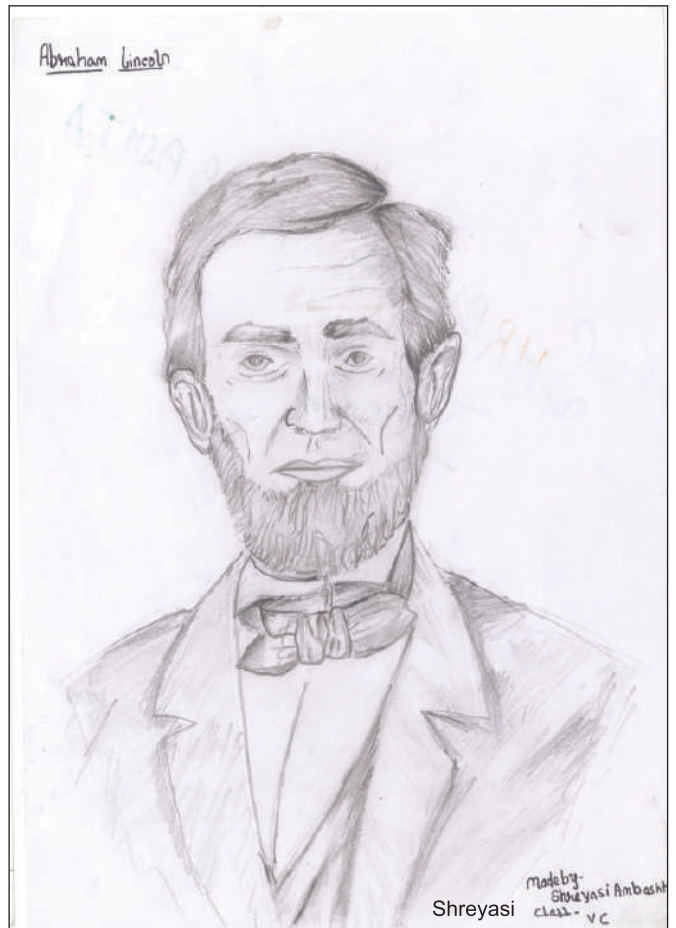
Enthusiasm, excitement and expectation mingled with some apprehensions are feelings which are common when you start any new project, but the last session was a real learning experience which made me strong and confident.

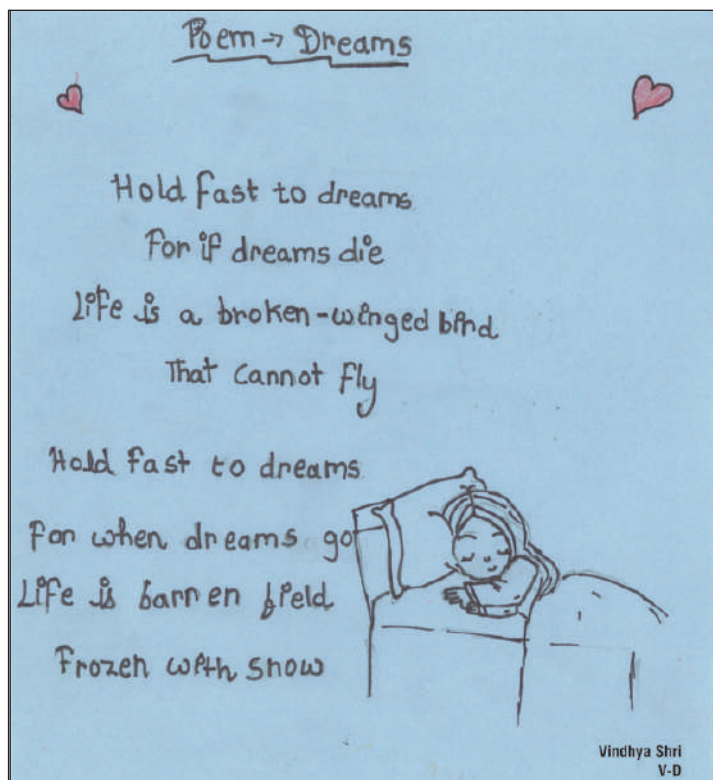
# Class V-D

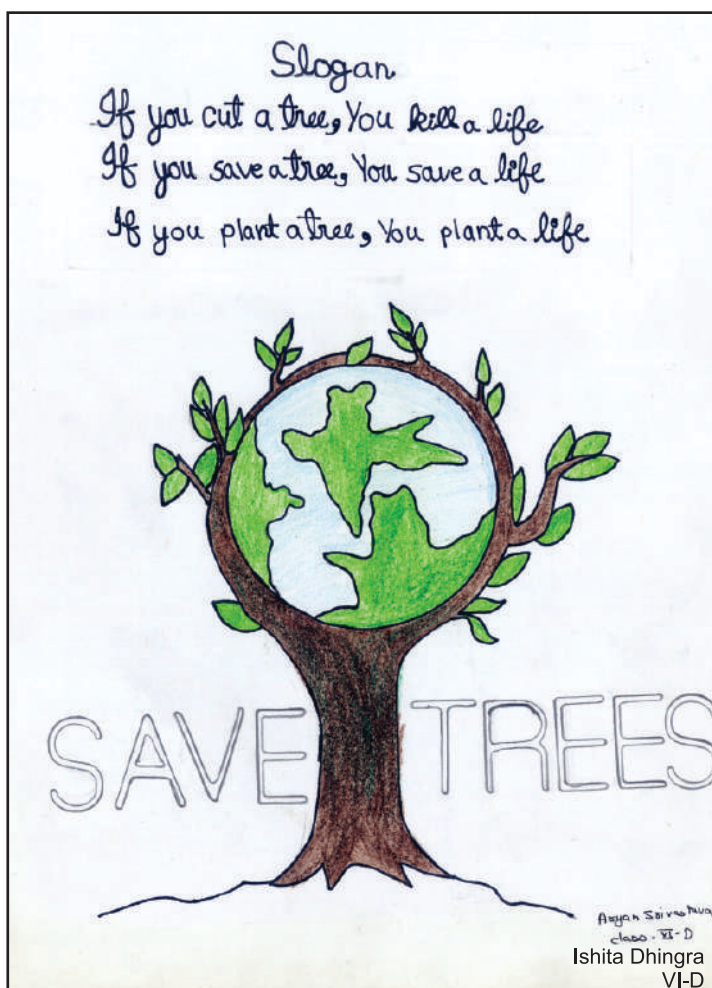
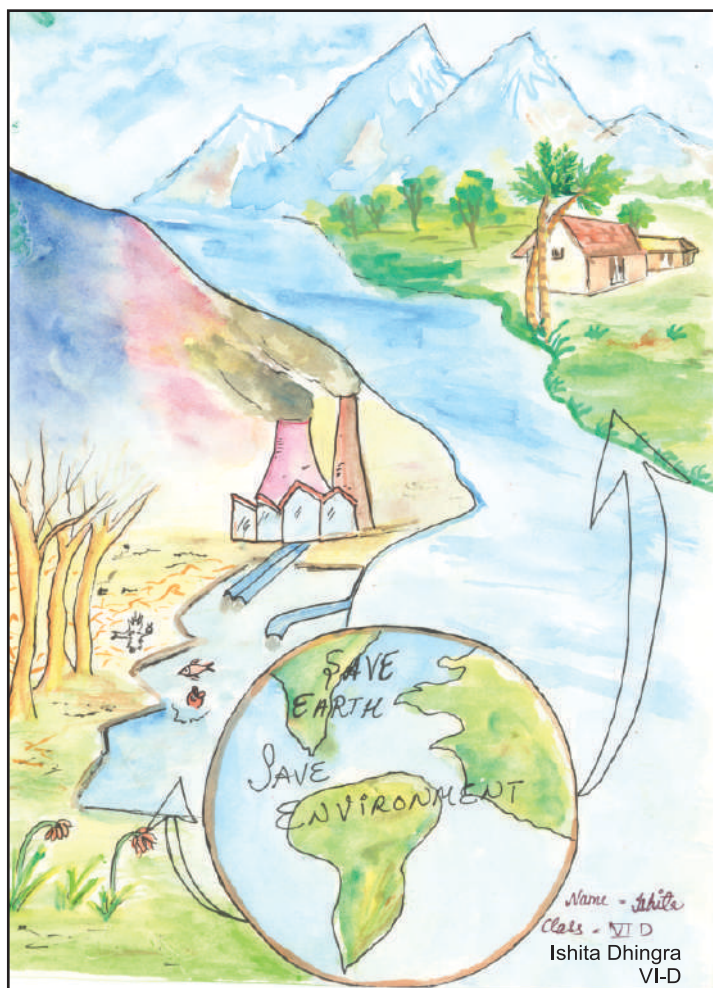
## The Salt Merchant And His Donkey

Wish them luck for all their successful endeavours & ventures, Hope! They pass every test of life with flying colours. Kudos !!!!









