## REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED IN THE MONTH OF JANUARY

<u>Jute Dabbing Activity</u>- Every kid is an artist. Our little Rallians of Pre-Nursery did jute dabbing activity on the hut using jute and brown paint and gave a natural texture to the picture. It not only helped them to develop eye-hand coordination but also provided tactile stimulation to children as jute has a different feel.





<u>Cotton Pasting Activity-</u> Kids love doing a variety of arts and crafts as an outlet to be creative and have some fun! They made fluffy sheep with soft cotton balls and had a lot of fun sticking them all over the sheep's bodies. They demonstrated self-control and patience and it helped in strengthening the muscles too.







<u>Button Pasting Activity</u>-Buttons are a great tool to work on finger and hand strengthening. In this activity, children pasted white, silver, and yellow buttons on Minnie's bow and beautifully decorated it. This activity helped them develop their fine motor skills and creativity.



<u>Number Matching Activity</u>—It is a fun activity for kids which helps the children with number recognition. Nursery children picked up the number and counted the beads as per the number. It provided the children an additional opportunity to understand and practice learning basic numbers and improve their numerical ability.



**Bud Printing Activity**- Bud printing activity was conducted for the students of the Nursery. They used earbuds and watercolours and made beautiful kites. This activity helped them to develop their motor skills. They enthusiastically participated in the activity and enjoyed it.



<u>Alphabet Tracing Activity-</u> Nursery students took an active part in the alphabet tracing activity. They flipped over the letter and traced it with their index and middle fingers. While tracing they said the sound of the letter (not the letter name). The direct purpose of the sandpaper letters is to teach the child the sounds of the alphabet through muscular and visual memory.



Origami Fish Making Activity This activity was conducted for the students of Prep. Origami is an exercise for a child's brain. It requires hand-eye coordination, develops fine-motor skills, and supports mental concentration. Under the guidance of their teacher, students learned the proper folding of origami sheets and made colorful fishes. They pasted those fishes in their scrapbook and created a water scene. Students were very excited and enthusiastically took part in this activity.



<u>Fork Printing Activity</u>- On the occasion of Basant Panchmi the students of Prep class made sunflowers with the help of a fork and yellow paint. Students dipped the fork in color and made a beautiful sunflower on their sketch file. Through this activity, they enhanced their hand-eye coordination, shoulder & forearm stability, and motor planning.



<u>Paper Crumpling Activity</u>- Paper Crumpling Activity was conducted for the students of class Prep. In this activity, they crumpled orange, white, and green coloured paper and pasted it on the picture of India Gate. Through this activity, children enhanced their fine motor skills.



<u>Skit</u> – "Social skills acquired during early childhood are often the foundation for success later in life".

Keeping this in mind, the teachers presented a skit related to social behaviour where they showed the children importance of sharing, caring, kindness, respecting elders, listening, taking turns, using golden words when playing with other children, and making them understand the difference between right and wrong.
