REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED IN THE MONTH OF JANUARY

Creative Owl Craft – The UKG students enjoyed a fun and engaging paper-pasting activity designed to develop their fine motor skills. They used pre-cut shapes like circles, semicircles, and triangles and pasted onto an owl outline.

To make their artwork more attractive, they coloured the branches and added googly eyes and a crown. This hands-on activity helped strengthen their hand muscles, improve endurance, and interactively enhance creativity.





Shabd Rachna- Using flashcards, UKG students actively participated in the Shabd Rachna (Word Building) activity, forming two and three letter Hindi words. This fun and interactive session helped them recognize letters, blend sounds, and confidently build simple words.





Flower Sketching- The Flower Sketching activity was conducted for UKG students to enhance their creativity, observation skills, and attention to detail.
